

# Structural Interventions for HIV Prevention and Care: A Virtual Institute World Café



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# World Café Objectives

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This session is designed for participants to:

- Exchange ideas that promote trust building in communities served through structural interventions
- Explore opportunities for meaningful community engagement from both structural and organizational lenses







# About World Café

World Cafe is an innovative process for engaging clusters of small groups on conversation about an issue(s) that matters to them - initiating opportunities for more meaningful communication, coordination, and collaboration to addressing the issue(s).

World Cafe offers an ideal way to find out what a community is thinking and feeling about a topic.

# Layout for World Cafe

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3 rounds of questions/conversations (15mins per round).

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After the first conversation, the host will remain in the breakout room', while the participants move to a new breakout room (each breakout room will be mixed up and assigned by the producers), taking their previous conversations with them.

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Each question builds on one another, allowing the host at the end of the third question to identify common themes and connect the various conversations together, providing a sense for what has been discovered and can be developed between us.

# Host Responsibilities

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- Set the context
- Create hospitable space
- Give voice to the question to spark responses from the participants
- Encourage everyone's contribution
- Connect diverse perspectives
- Listen together for patterns and insights
- Share collective discoveries







# Round 1: Question 1

## What does community of trust look like?

- What are the qualities of a trusting relationship?
- How is trust demonstrated?
- What knowledge, skills, or abilities need to be cultivated to foster trust?



## Round 2: Question 2

**How do we build trust between community members and providers?**

- What are the power dynamics at work, and how are they being addressed?
- How are we aligning our policies, procedures, and practices with the communities we serve?
- Who are community influencers, and how do we engage them in the process?





## Round 3: Question 3

**How do we build trust between communities and healthcare institutions?**

- How do we work with nonhealthcare-focused community partners to initiate trust building?
- What structures do we need in place to include community voices?
- Who are we not working with currently that can strengthen engagement?
