




Stigmatizing Language	Destigmatizing Language
HIV-infected person HIV or AIDS patient, AIDS or HIV carrier	Person living with HIV; PLWH Never use "infected" when referring to a person
Zero new infections	Zero new HIV transmissions
HIV infections	HIV transmissions; diagnosed with HIV
Number of infections	Number diagnosed with HIV; number of HIV acquisitions
Became infected	Contracted or acquired; diagnosed with
Serodiscordant couple	Serodifferent, magnetic, or mixed-status couple, couple with two different HIV statuses
Compliant	Takes the pill every [how often]
Prostitute or prostitution	Sex worker; sale of sexual services; transactional sex
Promiscuous	This is a value judgment and should be avoided. Use "multiple partners".
Unprotected sex	Sex without condoms, PrEP, treatment-as-prevention methods Condomless sex with PrEP Condomless sex without PrEP Condomless sex
Clean, as in "I am clean, are you?"	Referring to yourself or others as being "clean" suggests that those living with HIV are dirty. Avoid this term.
A drug that prevents HIV infection	A drug that prevents the transmission/acquisition of HIV
Risk/risky Risky behavior	"Risk" means a lot of things so just say what you mean: The specific behavior? Chance of acquiring HIV in the next year? Chance of individual sex act transmitting HIV?






I Prioritize Discussing PrEP With Same-Gender Loving Men Over Other Populations

The Health Promotion Items (posters, palm cards, flyers, etc.) In The Clinic Represent A Diverse Audience, Including Heterosexuals and Black Populations





Systems

- Access to healthcare
- Affordable housing in safe neighborhoods
- Addressing implicit and explicit bias of providers
- Ensuring all populations are informed, educated, and aware of biomedical and medical options
- Black Leadership and representation as decision makers and influencer for health strategies for Black community
- Healthcare framework must be a human rights and social justice framework
- Dismantling of destructive systems and institutions
- Implementing workable solutions to address root causes of social determinants of health, that elevate HIV vulnerability and risk.



Implicit bias: results from the tendency to process information based on unconscious associations and feelings, even when these are contrary to one's conscious or declared beliefs:



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- Implicit Bias impact on PrEP
 - Deciding whom to discuss PrEP with
 - Assuming who needs PrEP
 - Judgement on adherence
 - Judgements based on co-morbidities

Explicit bias	Implicit bias
Preferences, beliefs, and attitudes of which	Associations and reactions that emerge automatically,
people are generally consciously aware	without conscious awareness or intention
Expressed directly and deliberately	Expressed indirectly or subtly
Operates at a conscious level, in line with	Operates subconsciously, even in direct contradiction


